

I want Him to tell me the direction I am to go with my ministry. So what have I done during this silent period? I have learned to wait. One of my 5 New Year's Resolutions is WAIT.

Even when God seems silent, He has lessons to teach us. I have learned that His silence can be just as sweet as His voice. God's silence has taught me how to listen in a different way. I am going to teach you what to do when God seems silent, because He promises to never leave you or forsake you (<u>Hebrews 13:5</u>).

What to do when God is Silent READ THE BIBLE

When God is not answering your prayers or is silent about the direction for your life, look to His Word to seek instruction. God will always speak through His Word. You might not find the answer you are looking for, but you will hear the Holy Spirit guide you as you read. You can also learn how others have handled God's silence. I recommend reading the Psalms during this time. King David experienced silence from God on many occasions. In Psalm 10, David asks the Lord why He stands afar off? Even though God does not answer, David still prays. Never stop praying during times of silence.

God is also silent with Job as He goes through his suffering. Job lost his children, his livestock, and his servants. Then, Satan attacked his body with boils, yet Job stays faithful to God. Even when God finally answers Job at the end of the book, God never tells him why he suffered. Even though this is an unpopular topic in many churches today, God will allow you to suffer. He will also allow you to suffer more than you can bear, because He wants you to learn to lean on Him. The trials in life allow us to become more Christ-like. It also produces endurance. 
Are You A 24/7 Christian or a 9-5 Christian?

Share this life experience of Joel's of how He was a new member in the Air Force, and the call of God on His life changed him forever. It also changed his destiny and his career focus and how he would spend the rest of his life. It started with an inward knowing to attend Bible School and how God opened the way for Joel to leave the Air Force and begin his journey to attend Bible school. Let's pick it up! Joel was a career minded Air Force recruit. He wanted follow in his father's footsteps and be a career focused man. How to Walk in the Will of God



Many times, you will hear your parents and your pastors and teachers at church talk about "walking in the will of God."

What that means is to trust in God's plan for our lives, and obey Him. It sounds simple, doesn't it, kind of like two plus two equals four.

Most of the time, it is simple, unless we try to make it hard. There are many ways to discover and walk in the will of God. The main way is to study the Bible and follow it. It is God's Guidebook for Successful Living. Sometimes the Bible does not give us specific direction, such as whom to marry or what car to buy, or whom to have as a close friend. But the Holy Spirit Who is God leads us by peace in our hearts. If the peace leaves and does not come back--or is missing to start with--then the LORD is usually warning us away from something or someone.

One of the easiest ways we walk in the will of God is to trust and obey those people He puts over us, such as our parents, teachers at church and school, and other leaders--unless they are telling us to do something against God. This is another reason we must know what the Bible says, so we'll know the difference between right and wrong. Sometimes we may not understand why they are telling us to do something, or not do something, and we may not even like it. We may think we know a better way.

It is usually okay to very respectfully tell our parents and other leaders what we think about something, and to ask questions. But we must remember that God put those people in authority over us and that He knows best, and it is His will for us to obey them. This is called submitting to authority.

Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. "Honor your father and mother which is the first commandment with a promise that it may go well with you and that you may enjoy long life on the earth." Eph. 6:1- $\underline{3}$

Submitting to authority will continue all your life, no matter how old you are. It is the excellent plan of God, for we all must submit to authority. Even Jesus submitted to the authority of God the Father. He never did anything other than what God told Him to do, and He never said anything other than what God told Him to say.

So Jesus said, "When you have lifted up the Son of Man, then you will know that I am the one I claim to be and that I do nothing on my own but speak just what the Father has taught me. The one who sent me is with me; he has not left me alone, for I always do what pleases him." John 8:28-29

Most important, Jesus submitted to the authority of God when He agreed to go to the cross and die to pay for the sins of every person that would ever be born. Jesus did not want to go to be beaten and made fun of and spit on and killed, especially since He had never done anything wrong!

He even very respectfully asked God the Father if there was some other way to save all people from the horrible death of hell because of their sins.

But God said no. So Jesus walked in the will of God by submitting to the authority of the Father; He went to the cross and died for our sins, so we don't have to. Hallelujah!

Then God gloriously rewarded Him, for there is always a reward for walking in the will of God by submitting to authority. Some of the rewards Jesus received were that He came back to life and will never die, seized again the leadership of the universe from the devil our enemy, and lives forever as the awesome and perfect King of kings.

True faith, although indestructible, has the potential of increase or decrease, until perfected. Lack of faith is a denial of the sufficiency of Christ as Redeemer and Provider. It is distrust of who He is and His promises. When we distrust the spiritual realities promised to those in the faith, it will be revealed in our mundane earthly lives.

Consider the disciples' response when they were in the boat during a fierce storm (Luke 8:22–25). The Lord of Creation was resting peacefully in their midst. Fearing for their lives, the disciples rushed to wake Jesus, and cried, "Master, Master, we are perishing!" Pause for a moment and consider: Did they really believe that Jesus was their Savior, and that He was going to die that night in a boating accident? Their lack of faith led them to unwarranted thoughts and actions.

No matter what the life situation, whether common or crisis, how we react to it is a testimony of how much faith we possess. Every moment is an opportunity for either growth or atrophy. When you doubt your salvation, do you take inventory of all your pious deeds with the hopes of merit? Or do you consider the redeeming work of Christ and His promises for assurance? Do you resort to worldly ways for position or advancement for fear of not getting what is yours? All that we do is a reflection of our faith, and that faith bears the name of Christ.

Even in the midst of the disciples' unbelief, the Captain of their salvation was able to increase their faith with a rebuke to the wind and waves. Perfect faith would have let Jesus sleep that night. Instead, He awoke with a stern rebuke for the disciples, "Where is your faith?" Jesus is still in the midst of His people, and the question still stands.

Cheesy Ground Beef Skillet

Recipe courtesy of "Always Eat After 7 PM" Prep time: 20 minutes Cook time: 38 minutes Servings: 6

- 1 3/4 cups water
- 1 teaspoon sea salt
- 1 cup white rice
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 1 pound extra-lean ground beef
- 1 yellow onion, chopped
- 1 tablespoon garlic, chopped
- 1 red bell pepper, seeded and chopped
- 1 teaspoon dried oregano
- 1 teaspoon dried basil
- 1/2 teaspoon crushed red pepper
- 1/2 teaspoon sea salt
- 1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper
- 1/2 cup tomato sauce

- 1 can (15 ounces) kidney beans, rinsed and drained
- 1 cup shredded cheddar cheese
- 1/3 cup fresh parsley, minced
- 1. In saucepan over high heat, bring water to boil. Add salt and rice; stir once then cover pot and reduce to low heat 18 minutes.
- 2. In large skillet, heat olive oil. Stir in ground beef. Cook and stir until beef is crumbly and no longer pink. Drain and discard excess grease. Mix in onion and garlic; cook until tender, about 5 minutes. Add bell pepper, oregano, basil, red pepper, sea salt and black pepper; cook and stir until bell pepper is tender, about 5 minutes.
- 3. Stir in cooked rice, tomato sauce and kidney beans. Reduce heat and cover until vegetables are tender, about 8 minutes. Remove pan from heat, sprinkle cheese over top and garnish with parsley.

All Things Work Together For The Good.

For most of my childhood I suffererd emotional, physical, and sexual abuse. As the enemy would have it as I got older I began to act out in all the ways predicted for a person who suffered the kinds of abuses that I suffered. Low self esteem and self worth led me to look for and accept love from all the wrong people and places. I can't say that anyone around me had a personal relationship with God so all that I witnessed were disfunctional, unhealthy, adulterous, abusive relationships and so I began to believe this was the norm.

Also as predicted, as a young woman I began to want to escape from my own pain, thoughts and memories and I found that escape, (or so I thought) in the form of drugs and alcohol. This led to a period of addiction that spanned for almost 30 years ending with me addicted to crack cocaine and losing everything including my husband and children. Time after time I tried the Twelve Steps and time after time I failed in my attempts to stop using drugs. Almost everyone except my beautiful daughter Nicole had given up on me.

I kept trying, and my attempts led me to a long term treatment facility run by the Salvation Army. I tried this once and because of my intellect I could not receive God as the spiritual help that I needed to succeed. I felt like I was smart enough to follow all of the steps given me by the program and remain drug free. I thought I could do it all on my own. Little did I know that on my own I was no match for the devil and his antics.

Six months after I graduated from the facility, I relapsed and began using drugs again. This time, I admitted to myself and to God that I couldn't do this alone. I acknowledged that I needed God's help. I asked the administrators at the Salvation Army to come back to the program and go through it again. They accepted me and my children back into the program and I made a conscious decision to allow God to take control over my life. In the mean time my daughter Nicole had gotten saved and started to share her salvation experiences with me.

On December 22, 1999 I received Jesus Christ as my Lord and Savior and began my journey toward God's perfect will for my life. Thirteen years later, I am an Evangelist with a MBA, I am an Addictions Couselor and I teach Addiction Recovery at my local ministry. By the grace of God I am good at my job because of all the things that I suffered. Today I truly know that all things work together for the good of them that love God and to them that are the called according to His purpose. Doug Buchanan's From Satan To Christ Testimony



I was raised Mormon, in an abusive household. It seemed boring and lifeless to me, and I couldn't respect a religion my abusive father belonged to.

Growing up, I had emotional, behavioral, and developmental problems. Among them: Asperger's Syndrome, bipolar disorder, borderline personaliity disorder, and PTSD (as a result of the abuse). In addition I had a low immune system and chronic migraines.

When I was 13, in a search for power and personal development, I began experimenting with the occult and Satanism. After I was freed from a possession, I turned to Wicca, which I saw as lighter and safer and filled with love, which I now realize to be a lie and a disguise.

When I was 16 I came out to my parents as bisexual.

My parents kicked me out of the house when I was 19, in the beginning of December. I remember being heartbroken and scared, thinking I was going to die alone on the street. I managed to get a hotel room for a few nights before catching a bus to Idaho to live with a friend. Her landlord kicked me out after two weeks, as I was not on the lease.

From there I went to a homeless shelter and saved up enough money to go to Casper, Wyoming, to be with my long-distance girlfriend of 1 1/2 years, where there is a Christian Rescue Mission for homeless people. I was scared they would try to convert me. They didn't. I lived there for 3 months.

Near the end of the first month, my then-girlfriend cheated on me and I fell into a major depressive state. I was walking at night, and my left foot was run over by a pickup. I went to the hospital and got X-Rays. I was blessed (though at the time, in my ignorance, I attributed it to the Wiccan Goddess rather than the true God), as there was not even a hairline fracture. I was in a walking boot and crutches for two weeks.

At the library a nice Christian lady asked to pray for me to recover from my injury quickly, and I accepted. The next morning I had no need of the boot or crutches. Still I denied Christ.

One day I felt a need to go to the library and go to the second floor. While there, I met a Christian (not Mormon) girl, Danae, whose plans to travel to Texas that week had been cancelled due to unforseen difficulties. We now believe God planned that.

We quickly became friends, and started dating shortly after. I asked to attend her church's youth group with her, merely to spend more time with her. Then I went to church with her that Sunday. At my second youth group with her, I felt something stirring in me. My third, I felt the urge to tear off my pentacle necklace.

After that youth group, as she was taking me back to the Mission, I asked her to pull over in a secluded area so we could talk about youth group. She agreed. I shared with her my feelings, and told her about a dream I had had the previous night which seemed to suggest I would convert. We prayed. I pulled out my pocket knife and cut the string to my pentacle necklace, throwing the pendant across the street and as far away from me as I could.

That week, at church, Pastor was praying and said "And God, please bless the person in this room who has been dabbling in witchcraft. Release him from his bonds." Nobody in the church besides Danae, her mom, and our friend Noel knew about my history of witchcraft. I felt God's spirit in me then.

After church, Pastor sent out his weekly newsletter to members of the ministry, which included Danae's mom. She told me part of the newsletter, which detailed how Pastor had felt God telling him as he prayed to pray for the one dabbling in witchcraft. He thought it was strange at first, but knew he had to obey God.

My passion for God had ignited suddenly and powerfully. I obtained a Bible and a cross necklace and strove to learn everything I could about God and the Gospel. Over the next few weeks I attended church and youth group every week. I asked God into my heart, multiple times as I felt like I needed to show God how passionate I was about Him. Finally, only 2 short weeks ago, I was baptized. It was the most wonderful experience of my life. Even if the water was freezing!

I had been baptized when I was 8, like any Mormon child, but as I didn't choose to do it on my own and as I had left Christ completely, I felt like it was important to do it on my own.

I just turned 20 only three days ago. My journey to Christ has happened fast, and been completely life-changing. I am no longer homeless, and I no longer struggle with depression or homosexuality of any form. Danae and I are still going strong, and the only one I love more than Danae is God. I thank God every night in my heart for bringing Danae into my life and using her to bring me to Him.



I needed to make these choices too. When I was twenty years old, I wanted to kill myself... Depression had darkened my mind, and I tried to cope through drugs, relationships and success. Nothing seemed to be working. The pain of my childhood had me trapped in a victim mentality until the Spirit of God started to fill my mind and transform my thinking.

"Finally, brethren, whatever things are true, whatever things are noble, whatever things are just, whatever things are pure, whatever things are lovely, whatever things are of good report, if there is any virtue and if there is anything praiseworthy—meditate on these things. The things which you learned and received and heard and saw in me, these do, and the God of peace will be with you."

(<u>Philippians 4:8-9</u>, 8 And now, dear brothers and sisters, one final thing. Fix your thoughts on what is true, and honorable, and right, and pure, and lovely, and admirable. Think about things that are excellent and worthy of praise.9 Keep putting into practice all you learned and received from me—everything you heard from me and saw me doing. NLT)

Brother And Sister What's been blocking your anointing, gifts and passions? Is it fear or the pains of your past? Today is a good day to allow faith, hope and love to free you from your past. "And now abide faith, hope, love, these three; but the greatest of these is love."

Signs the Enemy is After You



The Enemy is a trickster and will use any tactic he can to get you to renounce Christ.

The Trickster is Near

The Enemy is a trickster and will use any tactic he can to get you to renounce Christ. He shudders every time you confess Christ. For practicing Christians who demonstrate a life in line with Christ, you are the Enemy's greatest temptation because he has an uncontrollable desire to shift you away from living a Godly life. Sometimes we don't even know when he's tempting us, because his attempts are so subtle. If you've ever felt like you were under attack by a negative force beyond yourself, that's the Enemy working to break you down. Here are six signs the Enemy is after you. It's important that you recognize these so that you are not defeated.

Broken Faith

Have recent life situations and occurrences caused you to drift off course of your spiritual journey? While many of us have busy lives and busy schedules, if you're constantly coming up with excuses for why you are no longer committed to being in active communication with God, you are probably being fed lies by the Enemy. The Enemy is a saboteur, one who deliberately destroys and obstructs. He will actively attempt to get you off course with God by telling you it's ok to deviate from God, sometimes in subtle ways. This could be the voice telling you there's no need to pray or stay in touch with God because he should know where your heart is. This could also be the voice telling you that there can't be a God, because if there was, you wouldn't be dealing with the situation you're in.

Depression

By definition, depression is having "feelings of severe despondency and detection". It causes feelings of sadness and loss of interest and can be a major clinical issue. When we're going through a period of depression, the Enemy is whispering lies to create self-doubt and sabatoge us. These feelings are not in line with what God wants for us. We are told this in Proverbs 16:20 "He that handles a matter wisely shall find good: and whoever trusts in the LORD, happy is he." James 4:7 is a great verse that reminds us to submit ourselves to God. If we focus on the positive and not our discouragement, the Enemy has no place. If we resist the Devil, he will flee from us.

Introduction

This Bible Study was designed for small groups. It is divided up in sub- divisions, or "sessions," each with its own questions. The best way to go about this study is without time constants, to allow your group to process this information and the Scriptures at their own pace. Some groups need more time in a particular section than in another. It is best to honor the needs of the group, and go at the best pace for them. If you do have time constraints, just proceed with the study in each session per week, and what you do not finish, encourage your group to finish on their own. To save time, have the group read the sections and answer the questions before the study; there will be more dramatic discussions. This study is Part I of a five-part series on relationships, and what the Bible has to say to us concerning them.

The topic of *Love* and *Relationships* is a very hot topic on the Internet and in many of our churches these days. There is much misinformation at best and blatant heresy at worst. Therefore, we are going to devote this study to help you search and discover what the Word has to say! Some of the subjects to be discussed are focusing on how to prepare yourself first, what to look for, what is Fullness, Biblical love, and Kindness, which lays the foundation for the development of quality Biblical character. Then we will be better prepared to build quality relationships. We will even help you learn some keys for a stable and loving marriage!

This study is not just for young people, or singles! What we are talking about is for all Christians who desire to find, and make good, lasting relationships work. Even if we have done it all wrong, so to speak, God can, and will turn it around for good when our attention becomes focused upon Him, and His precepts--from His Word. We have to know what love is and what it is not before we can be effective in our relationships!

My purpose in this study is to point you in the right direction, and provide for you solid, Biblical insights from my more than twenty years of pastoral counseling and Biblical investigations in this subject. It is my prayer, and plan, to give you a general overview of relationships from the Bible's timeless perspective. This is not a work based on the latest trends in psychology; rather, the understanding of the underlining Spiritual principles we all need to know and follow. *A Field Guide* is meant to show you the right path to take you through the maze of what all of us are to do, and to be. Consequently, you can learn and gain the most from God's Word to become better in all of your relationships, and to glorify our Lord.

I did not just wake up one day free from that maze; I had to learn how to navigate it in light of God's Word. I, too, had to struggle to keep from getting myself lost, and in trying to find my way out of ruthless situations. I had to overcome my fears from intense teasing as a child, overcome learning disabilities, dyslexia, and a seriously embarrassing speech impediment that caused me to be the butt of many jokes while growing up. I was once engaged, and realized, after a lot of agony and pain, that this would be wrong. I have spent so much time in my pastoral career that I have had, at times, few, and sometimes no relationships of quality or depth. It is my intention to help you find the right path, so you can discover and build healthy, and quality relationships that are centered upon Christ as our Lord. We will begin by looking at how to prepare ourselves with the right mindset, knowing what real love is, and learning about attitude and character so we can be prepared to bring about and build relationships, as well as developing a good personality.


